2015 FURTHER REGULATIONS

The highlighted sections of these Further Regulations are alterations to the “2015 Supplementary Regulations (amended 20 Mar 2015)”.

1. TITLE AND EVENT

The event will be known as 2015 Tatts Finke Desert Race and will be a National Championship Long Course Off Road Event conducted between Alice Springs and Finke (Aputula Community) in the state of Northern Territory on Friday 5 June, Saturday 6 June, Sunday 7 June and Monday 8 June, 2015.

The event will be Round 2 of the 2015 CAMS Australian Off Road Championship.

2. AUTHORITY AND PERMIT

The event will be held under the International Sporting Code of the Federation Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA), the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), General Conditions for All Titles, the Off Road Standing Regulations (ORSR), the 2015 CAMS Australian Off Road Championship Sporting Regulations, these supplementary regulations and any further regulations, instructions or bulletins which may be issued by the Organiser or the Stewards of the Meeting

The event will be conducted under and in accordance with the CAMS Risk Management and Occupational Health and Safety policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au.

The CAMS permit number for the event is **815/0806/01**.

8. ENTRY DETAILS

Classes recognised by Tatts Finke Desert Race for the purpose of awards are:

Pro	Pro Buggy	Over 1650cc and not exceeding 6000cc (P) / 7200cc (D)
Prolite	Prolite Buggy	Up to 3500 naturally aspirated
S1650	Super 1650 Buggy	Between 1330cc and 1650cc
Sport	Sportsman Buggy	Not exceeding 1330cc
P2WD	Performance 2WD	Modified not exceeding 6000cc (P) / 7200cc (D)
X2WD	Extreme 2WD	Highly modified not exceeding 6000cc (P) / 7200cc (D)
P4WD	Production 4WD	Not exceeding 6000cc (P) / 7200cc (D)
X4WD	Extreme 4WD	Highly modified not exceeding 6000cc (P) / 7200cc (D)
UTV	Superlite	Utility Terrain Vehicles with engines not exceeding 1200cc

Note: Utility Terrain Vehicles that do not comply with Superlite regulations will be permitted to compete, provided all relevant safety requirements are met. They will

be classed as Invited UTV and be grouped with Superlite class vehicles for the event, however WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR PRIZES / AWARDS.

10. CREW BRIEFINGS

Refer Article 10 of the 2015 CAMS Australian Off Road Championship Sporting Regulations.

Briefings for competing crew will be conducted on Saturday 6 June 2015 at 6.30am, prior to the prologue, at 6.15am Sunday 7 June 2015 (Race Day 1) and 6.15am Monday 8 June 2015 (Race Day 2) before the event proper. Briefings will take place at Start/Finish Line - Alice Springs (Prologue and Race Day 1) and Start/Finish Line Finke (Race Day 2). Attendance at each crew briefing by each entered crew member is compulsory, and each competing crew member is required to sign on. Sign on will commence 30 minutes prior to crew briefings. Cases of non-attendance are to be referred to the stewards by way of a formal charge, which may result in a penalty.

11. RUNNING DETAILS

11.1 REGISTRATION

All competitors must register at the Finke Desert Race Registration Centre; Finke Start/Finish Venue, South Stuart Highway, Alice Springs, between Tuesday 2 June 2015 and Thursday 4 June 2015, 12.00 noon and 6.00pm and Friday 5 June 2015, 9.00am to 12.00 noon. Competitors must produce their current CAMS National Off Road Competition Licence, current CAMS-affiliated car club membership card and CAMS vehicle log book.

11.4 PROLOGUE

The prologue will be held on Saturday 6 June 2015 starting at 8.00am. Vehicles will depart one at a time at one minute intervals. The length of the prologue will be approx. 8 kilometres. Competitors will start the prologue in an order advised by AORCom on the basis of anticipated speeds within class, and prologue start times will be issued with Further Regulations. Competitors not finishing the prologue may apply to the organisers to be seeded. The closing time for applications for seeding will be 12.30pm.

A reconnaissance lap for prologue will commence once the crew briefing has finished. Competitors are to make their way to the prologue start line in either race vehicles (in full racing attire) or in a private suitable 4WD. Race vehicles will leave before private 4WD vehicles.

The Armor All Pole Position award of \$500 will be paid to the competitor that achieves the fastest time, (is awarded first place outright) after the completion of the prologue. Eg 'Pole Position' for the start of the event. The \$500 cash prize inclusive of any GST will be paid to the winner by HP Sports Management via EFT.

11.5 START TIMES

Race Day 1 - Vehicles will start in order as determined by prologue. First vehicle will depart at 7:15am. The first ten vehicles, as determined by prologue will start one at a time at one minute intervals. The remainder of the field will start one at a time at thirty second intervals.

Race Day 2 - Vehicles will start in order as determined by corrected time from Race Day 1. First vehicle will depart at 7:15am. Vehicles finishing within twenty minutes of the leader will start on corrected time. The remainder of the field will start one at a time at thirty second intervals.

20.1 AUSTRALIAN OFF ROAD CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

Points for the Australian Off Road Championship and Tri-Series will be awarded as per Article 14 of the 2015 CAMS Australian Off Road Championship Sporting Regulations.

21. GUIDE TO COMPETITORS

A Guide to Competitors may be issued to each competitor with Further Regulations. This guide will contain information which does not form part of the regulations of the event, but will be of assistance to competitors. It should be noted that the contents of the Guide for competitors are of no regulatory value and may not be used as the basis of a protest.
